WILL YOU BE MORE BLESSED THAN THE QUEEN OF SHEBA?

I. Are you doing already as the Queen of Sheba did?

A. What did this Queen of Sheba hear and do?

1. She heard people talk about Solomon and his God (1 Kings 9:26-28)
2. She began to think about what she heard and decided to go see him

B. Who of you looks like this Queen of Sheba?

1. Who stands at your door 'knocking and speaking'? (Is. 55:1-3; Prov 9:3-6)
2. Who of you are doing what the queen did? (Luke 11:31)

C. What will the Queen of Sheba say about you when she will hear your story?

II. How will you be more blessed than the Queen of Sheba?

A. The queen was really happy after her time Solomon: 1 Kings 10:3-9

B. Yet you are in some ways more blessed than this queen: Lk. 11:28, 31

1. You don't have to travel far to hear the wisdom of God: Deut. 30:11-14
2. You have more than Solomon's wisdom: whole New Testament!

C. Still Jesus reminds you *just hearing* is not enough to make you blessed

1. "But be ye *doers* of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves." (James 1:22)
2. "Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will like him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock." (Matt. 7:24)

Closing Question: Are you more blessed than Queen of Sheba?

4. What could you share about God and His Son with a friend at school?

6. The Queen came to ask Solomon many questions. If you could ask him a question, what would yours be?

7. But Solomon is no longer on earth. Who now should you ask your questions?

8. Jesus used the queen as an example and as a warning. How does the story of

the queen warn us?
