# I. The Biblical basis for teaching doctrine

- A. The Biblical basis as set out in the pastoral epistles
  - 1. Teaching sound doctrines is God's will: 1 Tim. 1:3, 10; 1 Tim. 4:6, 13, 16; 1 Tim. 5:17; 6:3; 2 Tim. 3:16; 4:2-3; Titus 1:9; 2:1, 7, 10
  - 2. This instruction is founded on Lord Jesus' example and command
    - a. His example: Matt. 7:28 Mark 1:27-28 John 7:16
    - b. His command: Matt. 28:20
- B. The importance emphasized as in Titus 1:9-10; 13
  - 1. The cultural context is opposition with false doctrines (2 Tim. 3:1-7; 4:3)
  - 2. The three-fold purpose of teaching doctrine
    - a. 9a: exhort believers
    - b. 9b: convince opposers (vs. 10: unruly and vain talkers)
    - c. 11: silence false teachers
  - 3. The method of teaching: sharply (vs. 13)
- C. God's call to teach 'doctrine' is a timeless charge: 2 Tim. 4:1-4
  - 1. Solid doctrines are the bedrock of a Christian church facing waves of cultural forces seeking to flood away God's church
    - a. We must not bow to our culture. Culture must bow to Scripture.

- 2. God's call is to preach in season and out of season
- 3. Any church abandoning Jesus' charge to preach doctrine is doomed to die

## II. The Practical Manner of teaching doctrine

- A. Our Lord's command: teach all that I have commanded (Matt. 28:20)
  - 1. That includes all of inspired Scriptures in OT and NT
  - 2. How to do this most effectively?
- B. Paul referred to an elementary form of truths: 2 Tim. 1:13
  - 1. God gracious guided His Church by the Holy Spirit to give us 'deepened and expanded' forms of His truths in creeds, confessions and catechisms.
    - a. the main Reformed ones:
    - b. their nature is not *new* revelation but the *echo* of God's revelation
- C. God's call in 1 Thess. 5:20-21: hold fast what is good

### III. God's promise upon teaching doctrine

- A. God's promises in Deut. 32:1-2: faithful teaching doctrine will saturate
- B. God's promise in Is. 55:10-13: faithful teaching doctrine will transform
