Intro: Praise ye the LORD ... for His Word (Ps. 147:1, 19-20)

A. He gave us both books to *learn about* and *to learn to know* Him!

- 1. God knows His 1st Autobiography was insufficient
- 2. God calls us to give more heed to His 2<sup>nd</sup> Autobiography: Ps. 119:130 a. review your habits with regard to His Word: Proverbs 8:34-34
- B. But how do I know that the HOLY BIBLE is the Word of the Living God?
  - 1. Not because church parents teachers teach this (see art. 5)
  - 2. God's Word is true because God says it is true: Ps. 12:6; 2 Tim. 3:16
  - 3. Yet the most convicting arguments are insufficient to bring us to faith

## I. The Source of God's Word

- A. The Source of the Bible is Thus saith the LORD
  - 1. Examine Deut. 18:18-20 (Jude 14; Luke 16:31; 18:31; 24:25)
  - 2. Examine 2 Peter 1:21
    - a. meaning of moved by HG: (Acts 27:15, 17; 2 Sam. 23:1-2; Jer. 21:1)
    - b. meaning of holy men (compare Number 24:4; Job 42:7-8)
  - 3. Examine 2 Tim. 3:15-16
    - a. meaning of inspired (G: God-breathed) (2 Peter 1:21)

## II. The nature of the Book

- A. God's Word is a gradual revelation: Heb 1:1-2
  - 1. God's message came in fragments piece-meal little by little
- B. God's Word came as progressive revelation: Heb. 1:1-2; Ep. 3:3-5
  - 1. God spoke 'at sundry times and in divers manners' in addition to
    - a. at He added to His previous revelations
    - b. spoke in different ways to His creatures
    - c. most solemn speaking was on Mt. Sinai: Heb. 12:18-19; Deut. 4:32-33
  - 2. God spoke in Gospel days of Jesus Christ & His apostles: vs. 2; John 1:18

- C. God's Word is a *gracious* revelation:
  - 1. He gave us His 'written Word' as His Divine 'road-code' (Ps. 119:105)
  - 2. His purpose in writing it down was gracious: "... from a special care which He has for us and our salvation."
    - a. He wants us to know the way of salvation
    - b. He wants us to 'hear Him speak' anytime (Rom. 10:14, 17)
      - thus 'saith' the Lord/Spirit
