## **The First Petition in Our Prayers**

I. What is to remind us of? II. What is asks?

## I. What does the *first petition* Jesus places upon our lips remind off?

A. It is to remind us of what we are existing for God's purpose

- 1. We are the unique result of an individual act of God's creation: Ps. 139:16
- 2. We are not a random event but a purpose-made person: Is. 42:8; Rev. 4:11
- B. First petition is 'first' to reminded us daily of our purpose 1. Meaning of *hallowing* God's Name
  - 2. How answer question 'Is there anything we can pray for you?' a. typical answer

b. Biblical priority: 1 Cor. 10:31 & Col. 3:17

- C. First petition is very conviction: *do we miss our purpose*? 1. This extends over our very existence: Acts 17:25, 28
  - 2. This truth should not only make us blush

## **II. What does the first petition ask?**

- A. In 1<sup>st</sup> petition we seek God's enabling grace to 'show off His glory' 1. The first part of this grace is *having the right knowledge of God* 
  - 2. What happens when we *get to know Him personally intimately?* a. Ex. 34:29; Ps. 34:5; Acts 4:13

- 3. What happens when you reflect God's glory? (Matt. 5:10-12)
- B. In 1<sup>st</sup> petition we pray for His grace of *transformation* (2 Cor. 3:18)
  1. *Thoughts* (locomotive) flow into *words and actions* (box carts)
  - 2. To blaspheme God is far more than cursing Him
- C. In 1<sup>st</sup> we pray for grace to *shew forth His attributes*: 1 Peter 1:15-15; 2:9-10 1. To hallow God's Name is your lifestyle
  - 2. The details of this lifestyle is every verse on life of Christ or sanctification

Reflection: What is the most beautiful and most satisfying life to live?
