I. The Importance of the 4th petition

- A. Clearly not as important as the first three petitions: Matt. 6:33
- B. Yet Jesus listed the 4th as the first in the list of our personal needs

II. The confession in the 4th petition

- A. That we trust our Father for our day-by-day needs
 - 1. We come to our Father in heaven Who also Lord of all the earth(ly) a. Matt. 7:7-11; Ps. 50:10; James 1:5
 - 2. We must not make a wrong application: we will face needs! a. John 16:33; 2 Cor. 11:27; Heb. 11:37
 - b. yet all our needs will be supplied: Ps. 23:1
- B. That we acknowledge the Father's sovereignty in His providing
- C. That we acknowledge the bread to be *our* bread (1 Cor. 3:22)
- D. That we acknowledge that we share the bread needs: us our

III. The scope of this petition

- A. We ask for 'bread' i.e. all things necessary for body
 - 1. all things necessary is more than just 'food and drink needs'
 - 2. all things necessary excludes whatever beyond what is needed

- B. We ask for 'daily bread' (1 Tim. 6:8)
- C. We ask for our daily bread for this day (Luke 12:22)

Reflection: When we pray 4th

- A. We confess our life in hand of our Father Who alone cares & provides
- B. We are reminded to be moderate and content with 'enough'
- C. We are never to forget God joined prayer to work and work to prayer.
- D. We are to be inspired with daily gratitude instead of pride (Dan. 4:30; Deut. 8:17).
