Intro: The Belgic Confession is a confession of faith

A. Knowing Biblical truth is important but not saving in itself (Lord's Day 7.21)

- B. The Belgic Confession ought to be/become your personal confession of faith
- C. Approach these studies with Isaiah 8:13-14 in view
 - 1. Sanctify the LORD of hosts himself:
 - 2. Let Him be your fear and let Him be your dread:
 - 3. He shall be for a sanctuary:
 - 4. Or a stone of stumbling or rock of offence:
- D. Know that He reveals Himself to allure us to Himself (Is. 54-55)
- 1. He calls your attention to Himself: *I said, Behold Me, behold Me, unto a nation that was not called by my name."* (Is. 65:1)
- 2. He offers Himself to be your Husband: "Incline your ear; and come unto me; hear, and your soul shall live; and I will make an everlasting covenant with you, even the sure mercies of David." (Is. 55:3)
- E. Come then under His Word praying that you may learn to know Him rightly and confess Him gladly for both is eternal life (John 17:3)

Our faith in our God means we trust ...

- I. That our God exists
- II. That our God is One God
- III. That our God is a simple and spiritual Being
- IV. That our God is the sum of all perfections
- IV. That our God not simply good but an overflowing fountain of all good

I. Our faith in our God holds that our God exists

- A. The confession starts where the Bible starts: In the beginning God ...
 - 1. Bible doesn't explain God's origin because He has no beginning (Heb. 7:3a)
 - 2. God never calls us to understand Him (Job 11:7-9; Ps. 145:3; Is. 40:28)
 - 3. Yet calls us to trust Him (Is. 40:31)
 - 4. Our entire study of each article needs remain rooted in article 1
- B. To deny God's existence is nothing but plain foolish: Ps. 14:1
 - 1. Plenty of people tell us that to believe God exists is mind-game
 - 2. Why is to deny God's existence foolish?
 - a. to be able to assert this you must be able to prove it

b. by denying that God exist, the fool denies what speaks loud within • Rom. 1:18-25

Reflection: Do you trust, are you committed and devoted to our God?

A. How does your *faith in God's existence* function – shape – direct your life?

1. Do you see Him as a distant Being watching bad things happen?

- 2. Do you see Him as Divine Servant to fulfill your whims and wishes?
- 3. Do you struggle to believe in Him just and powerful God because the world is filled with injustice and suffering?
- 4. Do you have something of the faith of Paul as worded in 2 Tim. 1:11-12?

 I am appointed a preacher (...) for the which cause I also **suffer** these
 things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know **Whom** I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep that which I have committed unto Him until that day.
