Intro: To know God is the hidden remedy for our misery! (John 17:3)

A. To know God is a journey from fear (2 Cor. 5:11) to joy (Acts 7:55-56)

B. Don't be satisfied with knowing about God but seek to know Him

- 1. Pray over Jer 9:23-24; Gal. 4:9; Phil. 3:20; 1 John 2:13; 1 John 5:20
- D. To know God is a grace-privilege: Phil. 1:29

Our faith in our God means we trust ...

- I. That our God exist
- II. That our God is One, simple and spiritual Being
- III. That our God is the sum of all perfections (His glory)
- IV. That our God not simply good but an overflowing fountain of all good

II. God is One, simple and spiritual Being

- A. God's nature is spiritual according to Jesus' teaching in John 4:24
 - 1. God already clearly revealed in OT that He is spiritual
 - a. Ex. 33:20-23 (34:5-7))
 - b. 2nd commandment (Ex. 20)
- B. AS spiritual Being God is invisible
 - 1. God exists in a form vastly superior to anything we can know a. John 1:8; 6:46; 1 Tim. 1:17; 1 Tim. 6:16; 1 John 4:12
 - 2. Yet Bible saints saw God: 1 Cor. 15:8; Is. 6:1; Gen. 32:30: how possible?
- C. God revealed Himself in a form suited to our capacity (condescend)
 - 1. He revealed Himself in hundreds of names & analogies from human live
 - a. God compared Himself to animals
 - b. God compares Himself to people & their relationships
 - c. God uses physical body features to describe Himself
 - d. God reveals His emotions
 - 2. He revealed Himself in an appearance of Himself (theophanies)
 - a. God sometimes took on a human form
 - Gen. 18:1-2; 17 Ex. 13:21-22 (Pillar) Joshua 5:12-15 Judges 13:21-22 (Angel of LORD)
 - b. Greatest appearance of God in human form is our Lord Jesus Christ
 - John 14:9; 1:18; Col. 1:15; Heb. 1:3
 - c. The saints in glory will 'see' God: Rev. 21:3; 22-24 22:3-4

Close: What are practical applications this this teaching?

A. God will always remain a 'mystery' (Rom. 16:25-20; John 21:25; Job 26:14)

1. This should keep us humble when we speak about God: Rom. 11:33-34

- 2. This should fill us with awe & carefulness when speak to God: Is. 6:1-3; Ezra 9:5-6; Rev. 1:17
- B. God wants us to know and trust Him: Ex. 25:22; John 20:26-29
- C. God wants us to press on to know Him: Hosea 6:1-3
