Intro: Jesus' authoritative teaching brought 'astonishment' (Matt. 7:28-29)

A. It is His sermon on the Kingdom Life of His subjects

- B. It is starts out with the description of His subjects (Matt. 5:3-9)
  - 1. He describes them by what they are
  - 2. He describes them by their *inner disposition* (be-attitude)
  - 3. He describes them as blessed (now)
- C. The first seven Beatitudes are packed with amazing depth and harmony
  - 1. Exalts the work of Father (1-3) Son (4) Spirit (5-7)
  - 2. Exalts Jesus three offices as prophet (1-3) priest (4) king (5-7)
  - 3. Expounds misery/repentance (1-3) deliverance/faith (4) gratitude (5-7)

## THE BLESSEDNESS OF BEING HUNGRY AND THIRSTY AFTER RIGHTEOUSNESS

## A. Because this is not a natural hunger in a fallen creature

- 1. We all know what our natural 'hunger and thirst is'
- 2. We do not naturally hunger for righteousness: being and doing good a. Rom 3:10; Ps. 10:4
- 3. If you possess this hunger, Jesus declares you blessed
- B. Because this hunger/thirst flows from a discovery of a lack of righteousness
  - 1. The effect of this discovery is described from various angles in vs. 2-5
  - 2. The fruit of these discoveries the Spirit uses to stir hunger for Jesus Christ
- C. Because this hunger/thirst becomes more and more Christ-focused!
  - 1. Spirit's main saving work: to unite a sinner by faith with Jesus Christ
    - a. He endears the LORD our righteousness (Jer. 23:6)
    - b. Has He and is He increasing doing so in you?
  - 2. This hunger and thirst for righteousness in Christ is a sign of good health!

## D. Because this hunger/thirst will not remain unsatisfied

- 1. Jesus' promise is for you shall be filled!
  - a. definition of filled
  - b. promises of filled: Ps. 16:10-11; 17:15; 36:8-9; Phil. 3:21; 1 John 3:2

Consider: Jesus invites all the hungering and thirsty souls to Him at His Table
