Introduction: All trouble on earth began with one subtle question. Gen. 3:1 A. We still face this troubling and deceit-sowing questioning: 2 Cor. 11:3

B. There is but one safeguard against this: be in the WORD of God!

THE FOUR CHARACTERISTICS OF THE HOLY SCRIPTURES (2)

I. Authority: they contain the will of God

II. Clarity: they contain *clearly* what we ought to believe

- A. 2 Peter 3:15-16 is no good excuse for studying Scripture
 - 1. Some parts of Scripture are hard to understand
 - 2. He has promised in the use of it to grant His blessing: Ps. 19:7; 119:130
- B. 2 Peter 1:10 does not teach a common person cannot interpret the Bible
 - 1. Meaning of private interpretation
 - 2. God commands us to search His Scriptures: John 5:39; Acts 17:11
- C. What do you need for the right understanding of Scripture?
 - 1. Consider Eph. 1:17-18; 1 Cor. 2:10-12; 2 Cor. 3:14-16' Luke 24:25-27, 45
 - 2. Therefore do not open Scripture without fervently praying to God a. use 2 Cor. 4:6 or Ps. 119:18 as His direction
 - b. be patient for 2 Peter 1:19 is His promises

III. Necessity: They only contain what we need to know and believe for salvation

- A. *The BIBLE* is necessary to hear the Gospel
 - 1. this characteristic is highlighted in Romans 10:13-17
 - 2. Therefore Jesus gave His people the commission (Mark. 16:15)
- B. The 'necessity' also means Bible is necessary to maintain your spiritual life
 - 1. The teaching of Matthew 4:4; 1 Peter 2:2
- C. The 'necessity' also means we need Bible to know God & His will (Art. 2, 5)
 - 1. When born, we come with some knowledge of God: Rom. 1:19-20
 - 2. When born, we come with some knowledge of God's will: Rom. 2:14-15

(IV. The Sufficiency of Scripture)

- A. "Thus saith the LORD" ... are you prepared to heed His Word?
 - 1. Note His amazing promises: Prov. 1:23; Act 2:38; 5:32
- B. What if His Word are letters that are hard and seemingly irrelevant?
- C. Consider David's response in Ps. 27:7-9
