I. Jesus' petition for pardon preaches about our sin

A. How amazing is this petition: Father, forgive them ...!

- 1. Consider the setting: vs. 32-38
- 2. Consider the amazing revelation: 34a
 - a. in what He did not pray
 - b. in what He did pray
 - c. in Whom He asked
- B. How gently He framed His petition: for they know not what they do!
 - 1. What did they 'not know?"
 - a. they did know they sinned (Acts 2:22-23; 3:14)
 - b. they did not know how evil the sin was they did (Acts 13:27; 3:15 1 Cor. 2:8)
 - sins of ignorance are still sins (Lev. 5:17; Eph. 2:3)
 - 3. Our greatest sins are not against the law but against the Gospel: John 3:36

II. Jesus' petition preaches the hope for sinners

- A. It preaches there is forgiveness with God
 - 1. No truth more beautiful for those pierced & pained with sense of sin
 - 2. Jesus did not ask His Father to ignore their sins
 - 3. Jesus prayer for to forgive implies a heart-melting request
 - 4. Eternity will show how Jesus' prayer was answered

Close: What about you? Are you forgiven?

A. If you enjoy the gift of forgiveness, then you know something of sting of sin!

- B. If you miss comfort of forgiveness, know there is forgiveness with God!
- C. If you meet God without forgiveness, then all hope ends forever!
